

Google Slides: Using Hyperlinks to Create a Jeopardy Activity

Within Google Slides, you can use hyperlinks to link slides within a single deck to create a Jeopardy activity, tutorial, or a create-your-own-story path activity. This tutorial will take you through a step-by-step process of how to attach hyperlinks to create a Jeopardy Activity.



Case Study

Mr. Williams is a high school social studies teacher. He would like to do an end of unit review, but would like to make this activity fun and engaging for his students. Since he has access to G Suite, he has decided to use Google Slides to create a Jeopardy game. He needs to know how to create the main page with the Jeopardy categories and dollar amounts, and then how to link the dollar amounts to the corresponding slides with the answers.

Using Hyperlinks to Create a Jeopardy Activity

<p>1</p>	<p>Sign in to your Google Account and go to your Google Drive.</p> <p>Click on New (1) on the top left corner and then click on Slides (2).</p>	
<p>2</p>	<p>Click on Layout (1) and then select Blank (2) to remove the formatting from the slide.</p>	
<p>3</p>	<p>To add a shape click on Insert (1), Shape (2), Shapes (3) and then select Rectangle (4).</p>	

<p>4</p>	<p>Create a square on the top right hand corner and then one right below.</p>	
<p>5</p>	<p>Type in a Category in the top square and a dollar amount for the bottom square.</p>	
<p>6</p>	<p>Click on the plus sign (1) on the top right hand corner to add a new slide with layout. Select Section header (2) or another layout of your choice.</p>	
<p>7</p>	<p>On the new slide, type in the answer that will correspond to the \$200 slide.</p>	
<p>8</p>	<p>We now want to link this page to Main Menu. Right click on the text box and click on Link...</p>	

<p>9</p>	<p>Click on Slides in this presentation.</p>	
<p>10</p>	<p>Select Slide 1, as this is our Main Page. This slide is now linked to Slide 1, which is the Main Page.</p>	
<p>11</p>	<p>Go back to the Main Page on Slide #1. Right Click on \$200 and then Click on Link...</p>	
<p>12</p>	<p>Click on Slides in the Presentation (1) and then click Slide 2 (2).</p>	
<p>13</p>	<p>You have now linked the \$200 Square on the Main Page to Slide 2, which has the corresponding answer. Click on Present to see how the two slides have been linked.</p>	

<p>Click on the \$200 square. This will take you to Slide 2. Once the student has provided an answer, click on the text to go back to the Main Page.</p> <p>Repeat these steps to add more squares and links.</p>	
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Tip...

You can use the same hyperlinking method to create class tutorials or a create-your-own-story path activity. You can also use hyperlinks to link texts or images on your slides to external websites or files saved within your Google Drive.
