

Clicker Books App: Screen Navigation and Page Layout v. 1.4.3

Introduction

Clicker Books is one of five apps currently available from Cricksoft software. With Clicker Books, you can allow your students to make a Clicker Books while using supportive spell check, word prediction, magnification features and wordbanks. Have the book read by one of Clicker's voices or have the student record themselves reading.

Learning Objectives

Completion of this tutorial will give you experience with the following:

- Navigating through the various screens available in Clicker Books
- Tools necessary to make a talking book

This tutorial assumes

- that you have basic iPad skills and can easily open/close apps
- that you have the most recent version of Clicker Books installed on your iPad

Case Study

Mr. Smith teaches Grade 2 and wishes to create digital books with his students to add variety to his lessons and allow for inclusion of all students. He wishes to understand the basics of how to navigate in Clicker Books so that he is ready to make a talking book himself and then teach it to the students to use in their various story-telling and project work.

Depending on where the last user left off, your app will open to one of these five screens.












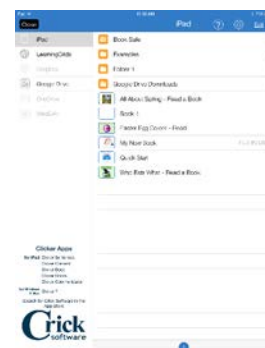

<p>7</p>	<p>To navigate from a book in Run Mode to a book in Edit Mode, tap Edit Mode in the top left OR tap anywhere on the screen.</p>	

<p>8</p>	<p>To navigate from a book in Edit Mode to a book in Run Mode, tap anywhere outside the boxes on the screen.</p>	
<p>9</p>	<p>To navigate from File Explorer to open a Book, select the book title and book will open.</p>

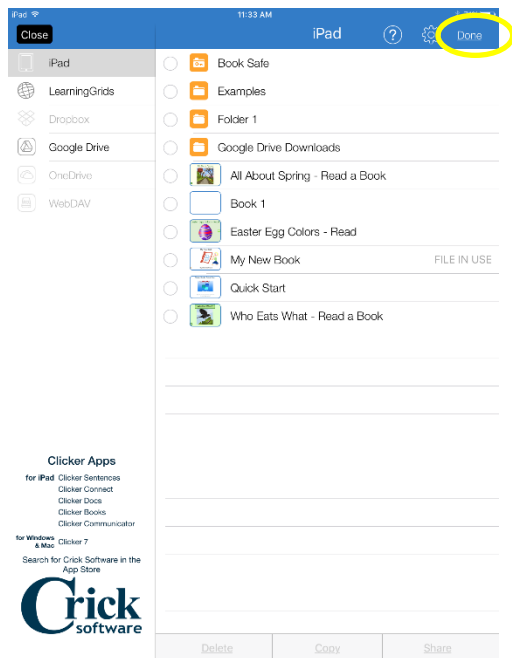
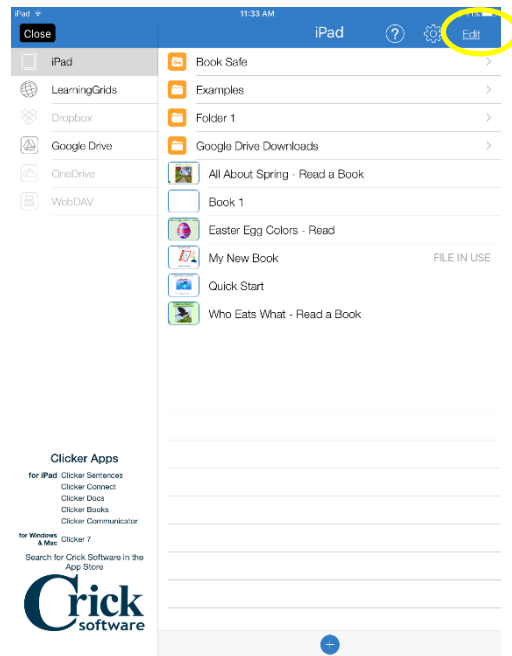
To navigate from a book in Run Mode to File Explorer (three steps), select Edit Mode in top left of run mode, then file in top left of Edit Mode.

In File Explorer view, it is possible to have two different screens: Regular File Explorer and File Explorer in Edit Mode.

To navigate between the two screens:
Select Edit or Done on top right of screen.



<p>12</p>	<p>From Edit Mode, you can enter Page Sorter mode, Explorer Mode or Run Mode.</p>

Tip...

You can easily transfer files made in the Clicker Books app to the full version of Clicker 7. Use Airdrop to transfer between Mac products (laptop to iPad).

For iPad to PC, you will need third-party storage capability such as drop-box.
